Chloe Woodard, Distinguished Young Woman of Simpson County, will be one of 29 Mississippi high school seniors competing for more than \$35,000 in college scholarships when the 2025 Distinguished Young Women of Mississippi Program gets under way Thursday, July 11, in Meridian, Mississippi.

The state program, which is held in Meridian, Mississippi, is now in its 68<sup>th</sup> year celebrating and spotlighting outstanding achievements of the state's best and brightest high school women. The three nights of competition at The Evangel Temple concludes on Saturday, July 13. The doors open nightly at 6:30 pm and each show starts promptly at 7:30 pm for the three-night event.

Reserved tickets for the 2025 Distinguished Young Women Program are available for \$65 for a three-night package. "Distinguished Young Women celebrates the outstanding accomplishments of high school women and offers them cash scholarship opportunities to further their education and to develop their self-confidence."

Chloe, the daughter of Christopher and Pamela Woodard of New Hebron, attends Mendenhall High School High School. Academic accomplishments, membership and hobbies include the following: National Honor Society, National Technical Honor Society, Varsity Cheerleader, Simpson County Youth Leadership and Track Team She plans to attend Xavier University of Louisiana to pursue a career as a High School Algebra Teacher.

During the week-long program in Meridian, participants are evaluated on scholastic achievement, fitness, self-expression, talent, and interview. **Woodard** has chosen a **Tap Dance presentation** of "Blame It on the Boogie" for her talent.

If selected as Distinguished Young Woman of Mississippi, **Chloe** will compete in the Distinguished Young Women of 2025 finals in June of 2025, held in Mobile, Alabama. There she will compete for the opportunity to win a share of more than \$100,000 in cash scholarship awards, including the \$40,000 national title scholarship award.
